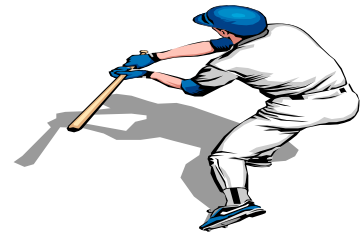

A. GENERAL

District 6 will conduct an open, single elimination tournament for Class A, AA, AAA and AAAA teams. The Champion of the "AAA", plus the "AA" and "A" champion and the runner-up will represent District VI in the state playoffs this year. The "AAAA" champion will compete with District 9 and 10 for a spot in the state play-offs.

B. ENTRY

Each school desiring to enter the playoffs is responsible to:

1. Calculate their Power Rating after their game on Tuesday, May 11, 2010 for "A", "AA" and "AAA" team entry.
2. Email (preferred method) or fax the Baseball Entry/Power Rating form by:
 - i. **Wednesday, 12:05pm, on May 12, 2010 for "A", "AA" and "AAA".**
 - ii. **Friday, 12:05pm, on May 21st for "AAAA"**
3. **Schools submitting their Entry Form and Power Rating after that date and time will not be entered into the playoffs.**

C. ENTRY FEE

A school, which has entered the playoffs, shall mail the \$75 entry fee payable to PIAA District VI to the Baseball Chairman on/or before Wednesday, May 12th, 2010 along with this Entry Fee Form.

D. SEEDING

1. Power rating – Four (4) points are received for each victory
2. Bonus points are calculated as follows:
 - i. One point for defeating an "A" team.
 - ii. Two points for defeating a "AA" team.
 - iii. Three points for defeating a "AAA" team.
 - iv. Four Points for defeating a "AAAA" team.
 - v. Two additional points are awarded for a victory over a team with a winning percentage of .700 or higher.
 - (A) It is the responsibility of the team claiming bonus points from teams outside of PIAA District VI to provide to the Baseball Chairman either:
 - a. School record on school letterhead signed by opposing AD.
 - b. Email confirmation of team record from opposing AD.
3. Total points earned would be divided by the number of games played at the deadline date to determine the rating to be used for seeding. Schools with identical Power Ratings will be seeded by a coin flip.

E. PLAYING FIELD

Games, except the finals, (which are scheduled for Blair County Ball Park) will be played on the baseball field of the opponent that has the higher Power Rating.

F. HOME TEAM

The team with the higher Power Rating shall be the **home** team and **host** the game.

G. BRACKETS AND PLAYING DATES

Brackets will be e- mailed to each school entering the playoffs on or before May 14th. Playing dates are:

Thursday, May 20	First Round
Monday, May 24	Second Round
Thursday, May 27	Semi-Finals (first round for AAAA)
Tuesday, June 1	Finals –Class AAA and AAAA
Thursday, June 3	Finals – Class A and AA

District 6 AAAA champion will tentatively play the winner of District 9 and 10 on Thursday, June 3 to determine eligibility for the state play-offs.

It is the intent of the District 6 Committee to follow this schedule, but we understand that weather and other factors MAY necessitate flexibility.

H. GAME TIME

The time schedule is as follows. Schedule days and times are subject to change.

Note: Infield practice times are listed above...NO SPIKES may be worn in the infield during this time. Batting practice will be in indoor cages. District 6 reserves the right to change game times, dates and location due to weather, field availability and school end-of-year schedule issues.

I. POSTPONED GAME

A game, which is postponed, shall be played the next day – except on a Sunday. The only exception will be if a school has Graduation or another event approved by the Baseball Chairman.

J. RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The school with the higher Power Rating will provide a game manager, the playing field (except for final game), at least six (6) new baseballs, ball chasers, and the official scorekeeper.
NOTE: The District VI Committee will provide the baseballs for the championship games.
2. District VI will hire and pay the umpires. Three umpires will be assigned for all play-off games except the Championship game, which will have four umpires.
3. District VI will award a trophy and 25 individual plaque awards to the champion of each classification.

4. District VI will secure and pay rental fees for Blair County Ball Park.
5. The winner of each game will report the game score to the baseball chairman **the day of the game.**
6. Schools will keep their local media informed.
7. Except for the final game, the host school will make the following phone calls when a game has to be postponed:
 - i. Opponents
 - ii. Umpire contact Person
 - iii. Chairman
 - iv. News Media

K. ADMISSION PRICES

No admission is charged for games except for the final game. Student tickets are \$3 and adult tickets are \$6.
